Frame Loom Tapestry Weaving Workshop Sat. Oct. 5th 2:30 - 4:30pm Woods Gallery



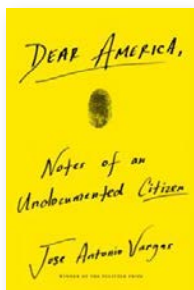

Vital Voices Book Club Tues. Oct. 15th 11am - 12:15pm Friends Room



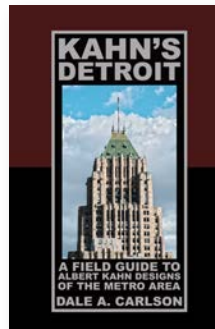

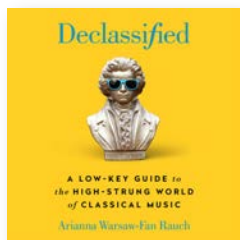


Excited for Halloween? Come to the library and a makeup artist will create any spooky Halloween makeup you want. Bring your friends and have a spooktacular time.
